Become a host organisation, be part of Climate-KIC!

Climate-KIC, a knowledge and innovation community, is part of the European Institute of Innovation & Technology (EIT), an EU body whose mission is to increase sustainable growth. Climate-KIC supports this mission by addressing climate change mitigation and adaptation. Climate-KIC does this by maintaining a world class European network of partnerships made up of dynamic companies, the best academic institutions and the public sector.

What is Pioneers into Practice?

The Pioneers into Practice programme (PiP) aims to create a new generation of low carbon entrepreneurs, intrapreneurs and enablers with the capacity to understand and manage the new type of innovation required to address the challenges posed by climate change.

Within the Pioneers into Practice programme, pioneers will get the chance to participate in the activities of other network partners. The programme provides you and other individuals from a range of different backgrounds with the opportunity to develop your knowledge about the dynamics and management of system innovation for the transition to a low-carbon economy in Europe.

Who can participate?

Applicants who have a University degree or at least 2 years of working experience in the field of climate change/sustainability which are working, living or studying in a RIC region or attached to a KIC Partner. For the international nature of the programme participants must be fluent in English.

In addition, future Pioneers have to be part of one of the following categories:

- Attached to/employed by an organisation dealing with climate change tasks
- Self-employed in the field of climate-change
- PhD student or Post Doc at a University or Research Center in the field of climate change

Why should you participate?

- Develop hands-on experience of low carbon innovations within a variety of organisational and international settings. Each participant will undertake 2 x 4-week placements in leading innovation projects in the Climate-KIC regions.
- Go beyond the boundaries of your own professional expertise or organisational background and acquire a broader understanding of low carbon innovation.
- Develop an understanding of transition thinking and systems innovation in the area of climate change mitigation and adaptation. This will be done through intensive workshops.
- Advance new ideas, which could form the basis for new innovations and ventures in practice. The best ideas can be put forward for support from the Climate-KIC Venture Support programme.
- Extend communication and networking abilities as part of a wider group of climate innovators.

Facts and Figures:

180 Pioneers from 6 different regions will participate in the 2013 Pioneers into Practice Programme. Taking part in the programme you will become part of a strong network of the 6 European partner regions:

- Central Hungary (Hungary)
- Emilia-Romagna (Italy)
- Hessen (Germany)
- Lower Silesia (Poland)
- Valencian Region (Spain)
- West Midlands (UK)

As a host organisation you will first receive a Pioneer from your home region for four weeks in May 2013 and/ or another Pioneer from one of the European partner regions for four weeks in October 2013. The Pioneer's expenses and contribution to his/her salary will be covered by Climate-KIC.
